## **Dragon Garden**

Built by the low-profiled philanthropist Dr LEE Lu Cheung over a span of 20 years in the 1950's, this magnificent garden is a labour of love for the nature as well as the local community. Ingeniously built with very ordinary materials and innovative recycled materials like beer bottles and granite slabs from a demolished building, the Dragon Garden is definitely ahead of its time in its concept of conservation, not to mention that it was the site of a James Bond movie in the 1960's. The preservation of this extraordinary garden despite the encroaching real estate development projects actually involves an inside story of the LEE family and the help from the public media. Pending upgrade to a Grade 1 historical building, the Dragon Garden is yet to open to the public. Cynthia Lee, the granddaughter of the late creator of the garden, founded The Dragon Garden Charitable Trust in 2006 to raise public awareness for heritage conservation in Hong Kong.
