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## Towards an Ecopoetics of Oceania: Thinking With, and Beyond, Epeli Hau'ofa's Asian Pacific Imaginary

The aim of this talk will be to invoke the Pacific subaltern regional category and/or global-local vision of ocean commons called "Oceania." The talk would open "Oceania" towardsmodes of trans-local solidarity and world belonging. At the core is an environmental ecopoetics, articulated via thinking with and beyond the Pacific and Asia imaginary of Epeli Hau'ofa's works, is the attempt to overcome national or more absolutely racialized and/or bordered frameworks of Asia and Pacific identity Ecopoetics would reframe sites (like Hawai'i, Taiwan, Fiji, and Okinawa in Japan, even South Korea) towards an affiliated poetics of trans-regional worlding, bioregion, and trans-local solidarity that has been there all along in "transpacific dharma wanderers" & writers like Albert Saijo, Gary Snyder, Wayne Kaumualii Westlake, Nanao Sakaki, Robert Sullivan, Susan Schultz, Craig Santos Perez et al.
