Globalization is evident worldwide in every market today. Within design however, globalization is often realized as a standardized form void of culture and tradition. Academiai is working to challenge this perspective with international education programs designed to broaden awareness and teach students how to appropriate global knowledge with local culture and traditions, as they will face this complex dichotomy in the future.
