The Implications of Image and the Obama Presidency

This project navigates ideas of racial representation within the constructs of politics, citizenship and participation. With the watershed of the new U.S. presidency comes the opportunity to assess the evolution of the multiple meanings that an African American in office implies. This session is intended as a forum for presenting, questioning and creating a critique of aspects of the image of Barack Hussein Obama and the shifting subjectivities that he inhabits.
